

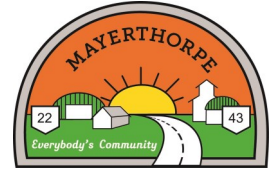

Mayerthorpe Fire Department is recruiting. Our Station is a proud Station serving your community and surrounding area since 1940.

Who is eligible to become a firefighter?

Adult firefighters must be over eighteen (18) and be in reasonable physical condition in order to perform firefighting duties. Applicants for the Cadet firefighting program must be between the ages of fifteen (15) and eighteen (18) years old and eligible to attend or be attending school, a minimum of 152 cm (5 ft.) in height and be in reasonable physical condition in order to perform firefighting duties.

If I have no training or experience, can I still apply?

ABSOLUTELY!! All necessary training is provided to new members. New members are expected to attend and complete courses in First Aid/ CPR, and Entry Level Firefighting. Subsequently, members are encouraged to take more advanced courses for structure fires, vehicle extrication, liquid fuel fires, dangerous goods, pump operations, apparatus driving, wildland fires, urban interface fires. Most of the courses are held within the county and are free of charge to members.

How much time does it take to be a member?

Members are expected to attend weekly training sessions.
Members are expected to attend as many incidents as possible.

Mayors' Message—2019 Property Tax/Assessment Information

This year's budget was approved at a Special meeting of Council held November 20, 2018. The Town's operating budget increased overall – 10.62% over last year's budget to \$4,471,132. The increase to the total municipal tax portion was 2%, which is in line with inflation for Alberta.

The 2018 Residential Assessment for the 2019 Taxation Year decreased by \$2,323,930 primarily as a result of market value decreases. The 2018 Non-Residential Assessment for the 2019 Taxation Year decreased by \$682,490 primarily as a result of market value decreases. Market value decreases are an indication of the overall economic climate in Alberta.

Overall, Council supports the 2019 Budget and looks forward to completing the various approved projects to support the growth of Mayerthorpe!

Important information you should know

PROPERTY TAX RATE IMPLICATIONS

Council approved an increase to the 2019 municipal Residential Tax Rate by 4.61% and increasing the municipal Non-Residential Tax Rate by 6.63%. In accordance with the 2019-2021 Strategic Plan, Council also approved increasing the Residential Minimum Tax Levy to \$858.00, the Mobile Home Minimum Tax Levy to \$525.00, and the Non-Residential Minimum Tax Levy to \$1,716.00.

Your property tax consists of Municipal, Education and Senior taxes, and if applicable, Local Improvement Levies. Property Taxes are for January 1 to December 31, 2019. **Please note: the deadline for tax payments, without penalty, is July 2, 2019.** Late payment penalties will begin July 3, 2019, and will be added to the balance owing at this time. Current taxes outstanding will be penalized at 12% on July 3, 2019. Tax arrears will receive a 12% penalty and will be imposed on January 1, 2020.

Please be aware:

Failure to receive a tax/assessment notice is not considered sufficient reason for non-payment of taxes. Late payment penalties will be applied after the July 3, 2019 due date. Tax payments sent by mail are deemed to have been received by the Town on the date of the postmark. Post-dated cheques are accepted.

WHAT ELSE IS ON YOUR TAX NOTICE?

Each individual property tax notice will also include the Alberta School Foundation Fund (School Requisition) and Lac Ste. Anne Foundation (Senior Requisition); these two **requisitions are set by the Province of Alberta and Lac Ste. Anne Foundation. The Town is required to collect and flow through these requisitions to these two entities.**

2019 Property Tax/Assessment Information

HOW YOUR PROPERTY TAX LEVY IS CALCULATED

Properties are assessed every year, typically these assessments are determined in the summer prior to the current tax year; property assessment takes into consideration the market value of the property. The Town develops Tax Rates based on an approved budget and change in growth (*overall assessment change*). The Tax Rates are used in the calculation formula, in conjunction with the assessed property value, to determine the tax levy associated with each specific property (i.e. *Assessed Value of Land and Building multiplied by the applicable Tax Rate per the approved Tax Rate Bylaw*).

ASSESSMENT COMPLAINT PROCESS

A person is entitled to see or receive sufficient information about their assessed property in accordance with Section 299 of the Municipal Government Act or a summary of an assessment in accordance with Section 300 of the Municipal Government Act, or both.

To discuss or review the specifics of your assessed property value, as indicated on your Combined Assessment and Property Tax Notice, please contact the Town Office at 780-786-2416.

If, after a review of your inquiry has been complete and you are still of the opinion that your assessment is incorrect, you may file a completed Assessment Complaint Form at the Town Office, within sixty (60) days from the "Assessment date" to the Assessment Review Board. These forms are available at the Town Office or on the Town's website at www.mayerthorpe.ca. Your complaint must follow the procedures identified under the Assessment Information section (*found in the Assessment Information portion of the Property Tax Notice*).

The Assessment Complaint Form must be filled out completely and the appropriate fee must accompany the Assessment Complaint Form. **Return the Form and fees by July 2, 2019 to:**

Complaints with an incomplete complaint form, submitted after the deadline or without the required fee, are invalid.

A complaint against your assessed property value does not exempt you from paying taxes on time or from late payment penalties. If a complaint is successful, the adjustment (in addition to a credit of your application complaint fee) will be applied to the tax roll. If you wish to have this money refunded, refund requests must be made in writing to the Town of Mayerthorpe.

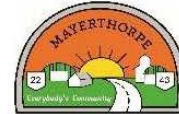
