

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are the hours of operation of the parks and green space?

There is no set time limit; however, it is recommended from sunrise to sunset.

Who maintains the parks and green space?

FCSS and Recreation department conducts annual inspections of the playgrounds to ensure compliance to playground safety standards and Public Works performs regular maintenance.

Do parks and green space need to meet a specific standard?

Yes, parks and green space are generally natural in state; however, if they contain picnic tables, garbage receptacles, etc. these need to be kept in good working order.

Where do I report suspicious activity at parks and green spaces?

You can report suspicious activity to the Town Office during business hours or contact the RCMP directly.

Do my children need to be supervised?

It is recommended that children be supervised at all times as no supervision is provided.

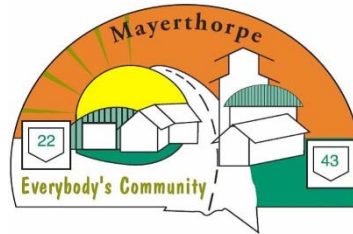

PARKS/GREEN SPACES

Dundee Park

Dundee Park was established by a group of dedicated volunteers to commemorate Dundee School.

Paddle River Park

Paddle River Park, comprised of 55.73 acres of green space, was established in 1967. The Town cleared space, erected a sign, and planted native seedlings in 2011.

Peace Park

Peace Park, containing 2.78 acres of green space, was established in 1992 where at that time a bench with a plaque had been established and trees were planted. The Town placed large rocks to define this area in 2011.

Sports Grounds

Sport Grounds is approximately 18 acres of green space where the exhibition centre, Diamond Center, aquatic centre, ball diamonds, gymkhana grounds, off leash dog park, and agricultural facilities are located.

Fallen Four Memorial Park (Non-Municipal)

Fallen Four Memorial Park officially opened on July 4th, 2008. The park was created in honor of the four RCMP tragically killed on March 3rd, 2005.

DIRECTIONS

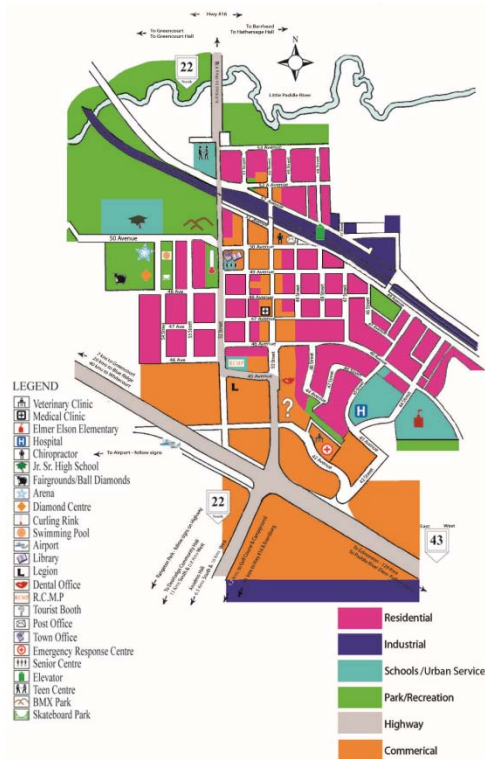
Dundee Park is located at the corner of 50th Avenue and 52nd Street.

Sports Grounds is located west of 54th Street south of 50th Avenue.

Fallen Four Memorial Park is located at 52nd Street and 46th Avenue.
